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CAMBRIDGE, MA—American Repertory Theater (A.R.T.) at Harvard University, led by Terrie and Bradley Bloom Artistic Director Diane Paulus and Executive Director Kelvin Dinkins, Jr., announced today its 2025/26 Season programming, including four productions in Cambridge; an A.R.T.-originated new musical on Broadway; a US tour directed by Diane Paulus of an A.R.T.-originated work; the premiere of an A.R.T. commission at the Royal Shakespeare Company; and the Lincoln Center production of an A.R.T. commission and co-production; as well as several special events and season-long partnerships.

In Cambridge, A.R.T. will begin its subscription season September 2 at the Loeb Drama Center with **PASSENGERS**, a thrilling theatrical journey that showcases cirque, music, dance, and superhuman skills to explore travel as a metaphor for life's ever-changing landscape. Running through September 26, 2025

and directed by Shana Carroll, **Passengers** is created by The Seven Fingers collective, the artistic home of the circus choreographer for A.R.T.'s 2012 Tony Award-winning production of *Pippin*.

Starting October 1 at Harvard's Farkas Hall, A.R.T. will present Sam Kissajukian's wildly original, Drama Desk Award-nominated solo show **300 PAINTINGS**. An autobiographical exploration of the ties between art, mental health, and creativity, this deeply personal gallery talk-meets-stand-up performance will run through October 19, 2025.

Beginning December 9 at the Loeb Drama Center, A.R.T. will produce the world premiere of **WONDER**. This adaptation of R.J. Palacio's *New York Times* bestseller and the acclaimed film of the same name from Lionsgate and Mandeville in development at A.R.T. follows Auggie Pullman, a middle schooler with a facial difference, and his family as they navigate what it means to belong. Celebrating empathy, resilience, and the power of choosing kindness, this new musical for the entire family is currently scheduled to run through January 25, 2026.

Wonder features music by A Great Big World ("Say Something," "This Is the New Year"), comprised of the GRAMMY Award-winning duo Ian Axel and Chad King, and a book by MacArthur Fellow and Pulitzer Prize finalist Sarah Ruhl (*Eurydice*; *The Clean House*; *Smile, a memoir*) with direction by Taibi Magar (*Night Side Songs*; *The Half-God of Rainfall*; *Twilight*: *Los Angeles, 1992*; *Macbeth In Stride*; *We Live in Cairo* at A.R.T.), choreography by Katie Spelman (*The Hypocrites' The Mikado* and *Pirates of Penzance* at A.R.T., *The Notebook*), and music supervision by Nadia DiGiallonardo (*Real Women Have Curves, 1776*, *Waitress*, and *Pippin* at A.R.T. and on Broadway).

Beginning May 26, 2026 at the Loeb Drama Center, A.R.T. will produce *BLACK SWAN*, a world-premiere musical. This A.R.T.-developed adaptation of the 2010 Academy Award-nominated psychological thriller explores ambition, rivalry, and the cost of perfection. *Black Swan* will be directed and choreographed by Tony Award winner Sonya Tayeh (*Gatsby* at A.R.T., *Moulin Rouge! The Musical* on Broadway) with music supervision and direction by **Or Matias** (*Moby-Dick, The Great Comet*). It features a book by Guggenheim Fellow Jen Silverman (*The Roommate, Collective Rage: A Play in 5 Betties*) and a score by Obie Award winner Dave Malloy (*Moby-Dick, The Great Comet, Beowulf, Ghost Quartet, Three Pianos*), and is based on the Searchlight Pictures film *Black Swan*, story by Andres Heinz. *Black Swan* is currently scheduled to run through June 28, 2026.

A.R.T. will hold a **special gala performance** of *Black Swan* on Thursday, June 4, 2026, at the Loeb Drama Center. Details will be announced in the coming months.

"A.R.T.'s 2025/26 Season is a testament to the power of theater as a live event—from the thrilling physicality and choreography of *Passengers* and *Black Swan* to the intimate performance of *300 Paintings*, to the deeply inspiring and heartfelt experience of the new musical *Wonder*," said Terrie and Bradley Bloom Artistic Director Diane Paulus. "Exploring themes of ambition, empathy, transformation and discovery, these shows all grapple with what it means to be human."

Three- and four-play subscriptions starting at \$149 (including a \$20 per order subscription administration fee) are available to A.R.T. supporters on June 5 and will be available to renewing subscribers and the general public in the coming weeks. A.R.T. productions will also continue to be seen beyond its Harvard University headquarters.

The theater's Tony Award-nominated production of *REAL WOMEN HAVE CURVES: THE MUSICAL* continues its critically acclaimed run at the James Earl Jones Theater on Broadway. A.R.T. developed and premiered the new musical at the Loeb Drama Center in December 2023. The show about big dreams, female friendship, and the immigrant experience received 12 award nominations this spring. It features music and lyrics by Joy Huerta and Benjamin Velez and a book by Lisa Loomer with Nell Benjamin. Based on the play by Josefina López and HBO's *Real Women Have Curves* screenplay by Josefina López and George LaVoo, the production features direction and choreography by Sergio Trujillo and music supervision by Nadia DiGiallonardo.

Beginning in fall 2025, A.R.T. Artistic Director Diane Paulus will direct the US concert tour of **DEAR EVERYTHING**, which was commissioned and developed by A.R.T. and premiered in concert form as **WILD**: **A Musical Becoming** at the Loeb Drama Center in December 2021. **Dear Everything** is written by Tony and Obie Award-winning playwright V (formerly Eve Ensler), with music by Grammy and Golden Globenominated songwriter Justin Tranter, Caroline Pennell, and Eren Cannata, lyrics by V, Caroline Pennell, and Justin Tranter, with contributions by Tony and Obie Award winner, Idina Menzel. The tour will be produced by V-Day, the global activist movement to end violence against women, gender expansive people, and the Earth, and directed by Diane Paulus. Tour dates, stops, and cast will be announced at a later date.

In January 2026, the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC) will premiere **ALL IS BUT FANTASY**, an A.R.T. commission written and composed by award-winning artist Whitney White. Across two high-energy performances, this groundbreaking theatrical event with by a red-hot soundtrack of musical genres from rock and soul to pop and gospel explores the stories of Shakespeare's Lady Macbeth, Juliet, Emelia, and Richard III and asks: Can you have ambition and love and still be alive in Act V? White stars in and directs **All Is But Fantasy**. A.R.T. commissioned **All Is But Fantasy** in 2021 in conjunction with producing the world premiere of **Macbeth In Stride**, Lady Macbeth's story, which **The Boston Globe** called, "Electric...powered by White's galvanizing performance." In February 2026, Lincoln Center Theater will produce the Off-Broadway premiere of **NIGHT SIDE SONGS** by the Lazours (Daniel Lazour and Patrick Lazour), which was commissioned by A.R.T. and received its world premiere production from A.R.T. and Philadelphia Theatre Company in spring 2025. In addition:

- **WAITRESS**—developed and premiered at A.R.T. in August 2015—runs in Mexico City in the show's first Spanish-language production. The Broadway production featuring Sara Bareilles is currently available to stream on various platforms.
- **LIFE OF PI**—which received its North American premiere at A.R.T. in December 2022—continues its US tour.
- NOTES FROM THE FIELD—which A.R.T. produced in August 2016—is currently available on HBO.
- **ALL THE WAY**—which A.R.T. produced in September 2013 and subsequently won the Tony Award for Best New Play—is currently available on HBO.

Throughout the 2025/26 Season, A.R.T. will continue to:

- Develop **Essential Questions** that will drive artistic exploration and audience engagement opportunities around each production;
- Partner with **Dr. Charmain Jackman** and **Innopsych** to support our artists and curate audience resources for learning, healing, and understanding around the themes and ideas sparked by our productions;
- Host free public events with Harvard scholars exploring themes related to its productions;
- Invest in creative artists and develop new theatrical work;
- Operate the **Lavine Learning Lab**, fostering season-long engagement rooted in A.R.T. programming with students from partner public high schools in Greater Boston.
